What is Wouff-Hong? On All Bands: An Amateur Radio Blog by DX Engineering quotes page 11 of the 1930 Radio Amateur's Handbook: ""The Wouff-Hong is amateur radio's most sacred symbol and stands for the enforcement of law and order in amateur operation." https://www.onallbands.com/what-is-a-the-wouff-hong/

An earlier mention of the ARRL "charm" as Hiram Maxim Percy called it, was after the Chicago Convention in 1920. — "Maxim And Warner Back From Meeting of Wireless Fans." 8 September 1920, *Harford [Connecticut] Courant*, p. 11.

"The word is believed to have originated with the 'Old Man,' for years a contributor to the amateur magazine 'QST," but whose real identity and general status in amateur radio has never been revealed.

One story has it that the 'Wouff-Hong' is an instrument used to eliminate interference by annihilation of those who are over zealous in their use of the ether. ...

'Wouff-Hong' [had] its beginning at an amateur convention in Flint, Michigan, at which time several hundred canditates were initiated." — 'Wouff-Hong Order To Hold Initiation At Meeting In Chicago." *The [Louisville, Kentucky,] Couier-Journal,* 12 August 1923, p. 8.



he Harrisburg Radio Amateur Club Inc., [HRAC] formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II, many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fifty-eight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a non-profit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways. HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has two hamfests throughout the year: July's Firecracker Hamfest /Eastern Pa Section Convention is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the convention, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: The well attended WinterFest in January is an indoor tailgate fest.

#### July 14, End of An Era.

The last "Franken-FM" low-power analog radio stations, occupying the audio end of TV channel 6 or 87.5 MHz, went off the air 12 years after the FCC mandated TV channel change to digital transmissions. During Sporatic E skip, some of these stations could be heard nationwide.

#### National Radio Day, August 20.

Marks the first commercial radio broadcasting by the Detroit News, callsign 8MK, and survives today as WWJ. But, the celebration if more about the predecessors of early radio: Marconi, Tesla, Maxwell and many others.

### US Postal Service Rate Increase — 29 August 2021

Most OM's use services like <u>eQSL.cc</u>, ARRL's <u>Logbook Of The World</u>, and <u>ClubLog</u> for QSL verification. But, if you are still traditional and prefer those paper cards, rates rise the 29th for First-Class domestic letters from 55 to 58 cents; postcards from 36 to 40 cents; international letters and postcards weighing at one ounce from \$1.20 to \$1.30. ### Replacing Your Amateur Radio License Plate in Pennsylvania.

"Hey Curt, your license plate is looking kinda aged," exclaimed **Glenn, K3SWZ**, at the club meeting. "Tell me something I don't know. I've had it for over 20 years," I replied.

My personalized amateur radio license plate is pealing and worn down having been proudly attached to three-car lives later. So — time to replace it. Glenn proceeded to guide me in the process.

Need to replace your tag? There are two ways to do it. If you are stopped by a police officer, and he agrees your plate is unreadable, he can sign off on PennDot form MV-44 (Application for Duplicate Registration Card, Replacement of Registration Plate or Weight Class Sticker). You may receive a new plate FREE.

But, if your plate is just aged and not gracing your handsome jalopy in the manner of your style, use form MV-904 (Application For Personalized, Amateur Radio Operator or Press Photographer Registration Plate). The replacement fee is \$11, plus submitting a copy of your official FCC license and a plate photograph with the application. But note:

"A registration plate is deemed illegible when one or more numbers or letters cannot be recognized from 50 feet or if the registration plate shows any blistering, peeling, discoloration or loss of reflectivity over the course of time rather than through a specific incident that damaged the registration plate. There is no fee for the replacement of an illegible standard issue personalized registration plate."

So, it's essentially a judgment call from the Transportation employee if you pay or not. (I sent the money to avoid delay; maybe I'll get a refund.) Allow ten weeks for replacement.

#### ARRL New Committee.

"On July 17th, the ARRL Board of Directors had their bi-annual meeting in Newington. Probably the most significant accomplishment was the creation of a new standing committee.

The ARRL Board of Directors approved By-Law changes creating a third Standing Committee that joins the existing Administration and Finance Committee and Programs and Services Committee.

The charter of the new Emergency Communications and Field Services Committee (EC-FSC) is to develop and recommend new or modified Board policy and programs for emergency communications through the Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®) and National Traffic System™ (NTS™) entities.

The committee also will offer enhanced support for its Field Organization leadership volunteers, including Section Managers, and an increased focus on ARRL-Affiliated Clubs.

The EC-FSC will further provide guidance to the CEO in translating Board policy into prioritized tasking, funding, and staffing of programs, services, and training in support of amateur radio emergency communications, field organization volunteers, and recruitment and retention of new and existing members through assistance to Affiliated and Special Service Clubs.

The EC-FSC will have additional responsibility for monitoring and assessing trends in emergency communications technology and participant skills worldwide, and for identifying "best practices" for voluntary emergency communications provided by ARES and NTS, coordinating and cooperating with other amateur radio national societies as appropriate." — Extract, 28 July 2021 email from:
