he Harrisburg Radio Amateur Club Inc., [HRAC] formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II, many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fiftyeight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a non-profit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways. HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has two hamfests throughout the year: July's Firecracker Hamfest /Eastern Pa Section Convention is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the convention, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: The well attended WinterFest in January is an indoor tailgate fest.

Volunteers Needed: <u>Ironmasters Challenge</u>

"I am still considerably short on volunteers for the walk/run event which is scheduled to take place on **Sunday**, **September 26** at the **Pine Grove Furnace State Park**. This will be the 12th year that we have supported this event.

Would you like some excitement? How about setting up a station and operating out in the field? This event takes place around the Pine Grove Furnace State Park. It consists of two hikes, a 30 miler and a 9 miler.... Both hikes take place on the same day. Between the two hikes there will probably be in excess of 500 hikers.

Our responsibility is to man the Starting/ending location, the two (2) check points, and a water station. ... These are both difficult hikes that take the participants into remote areas several miles from any access roads. ... This is NOT a stroll through the woods!

We would like to have at least 4 communicators/loggers at each check point. Communications for this event will be run on the South Mountain Radio Amateurs (SMRA) 145.43 repeater located in Mount Holly Springs. ... a simple HT with a rubber ducky antenna will suffice for most communications.

- 1. We need at least 9 people at the two check points. 5 at CP1 and 4 at CP2....
- 2. ... 3 people to assist the Net Control station....
- 3. ... 2 communicators to man the Water Stop (WS) located at the boat rental facility next to Laurel Lake
- 4. ... 2 or 3 communicators to man the event ending point at the Ironmasters Mansion.
- 5. ... 3 sweep hikers to ensure that we haven't left anyone out on the hike route. Must be able to hike 10 miles.

Memorial Lake State Park is located within the Fort Indiantown Gap National Guard Training Site. It has been a key installation for the Army and the Pennsylvania National Guard for more than 90 years. Memorial Lake was established in 1945 in memory and honor of Pennsylvania National Guard soldiers who served in World War I and II. In 1955, Memorial Lake was transferred to the Department of Forest and Waters, now the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, and became Memorial Lake State Park. It is a fitting location to commemorate the Anniversary.

Expected frequencies: 7.265 and 14.265 ± QRM. We will be setting up the trailer near the parking area off of Lower Road near some picnic tables. There are also charcoal grills available. Requested Guarded Frequencies:

Haiti: In a statement received by ARRL on August 14, 2021, Region 2 of the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU-R2) has requested that radio amateurs in the Americas keep the following frequencies clear to support emergency communications in Haiti following an earthquake.

The frequencies are: 3750 kHz, 7150 kHz, and 14330 kHz.

Mr. Jean-Robert Gaillard, HH2JR, President of the Radio Club of Haiti, reported significant structural damage. — ARRL Special Bulletin 10, 17 August 2021.

FEMA: Channels 1 and 2 on 60 meters will be available starting on August 30 for interoperability between US government and US amateur radio stations involved in Hurricane Ida emergency communications. This situation will remain in place until the storm has passed and the need for these channels no longer exists, or on September 6, whichever comes

These frequencies will be used: Channel 1 Primary voice traffic 5332 kHz channel center, 5330.5 kHz USB voice; and Channel 2 Digital traffic 5348 kHz channel center, 5346.5 kHz USB with 1.5 kHz offset to center of digital waveform. Stations on 60 meters are asked to yield to operational traffic related to Hurricane Ida. — ARRL, 30 August 2021; http:// www.arrl.org/news/fema-announces-hf-interoperabilityactivity-on-60-meter-channels-1-and-2

n his 28 August email George discusses many topics regarding EMCOMM. He does not expect activation of the Section for an emergency as hurricane season peaks. But, keep in mind, "We may experience flooding in some areas, and local ARES groups may be pressed into service.

ARES member: check your Go-Kit. "Charge up your spare batteries, test your radios and antennas and contact your counties ARRL Emergency Coordinator to let them know you are available.

Note traffic potential on EPAEPTN (3918 kHz at 1700L) and PTN (3585 kHz at 1900L). "Please check

into these nets and be prepared to assist." Message traffic is not routed into a stormaffected area until after the emergency is resolved.

> "The 'Good Old Days' of EMCOMM are in the distant past. If you are not a member of your county ARES, contact your local ARES Emergency Coordinator and volunteer. We need people, but we need TRAINED people. The days of just showing up with an HT are long gone. We have specific training tasks for each level. Our served agencies such as the county EMA's, the Red Cross, etc, with which we have established Memorandums Of Understanding (MOU) expect professionalism and knowledge. If you are certified as ARES Level Three you are eligible to volunteer to serve outside of your local area. Level One and Two stay home to assist in your county."

George also notes that before volunteering and rushing out to assist, "...make sure YOU are prepared. Can I function at a level where I won't become a liability. Face it, we're all getting older."

Other news: ARRL will be switching from Zoom to Microsoft Teams software for virtual meetings.

"We plan on holding more webinars this Fall and Winter. I would like to hear from you about topics you would like to see covered. We have many very knowledgeable Hams in EPA and most are just waiting for a chance to share their skills.

Finally VOLUNTEER! There is always something you can help with be it in your local club, with ARES, or helping me at the Section level. Positions exist waiting for you to fill them.
