Four operators in rotation using both phone and digital modes resulted in 85 Qs, 72 SSB, and 13 FT8. Over 20 people were in attendance over the day, including 11 club members with entourages. The event caught the attention of two others who stopped by to learn more. A Park Ranger also visited, showing appreciation for the event.

he Harrisburg Radio Amateur Club Inc., [HRAC] formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II, many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fiftyeight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a non-profit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways. HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has two hamfests throughout the year: July's Firecracker Hamfest /Eastern Pa Section Convention is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the convention, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: The well attended WinterFest in January is an indoor tailgate fest.



Quick Ways to Determine Propagation



Web-based Software Defined Radio (SDR). Listen to a station located near you. The website www.websdr.org has a list of worldwide stations. In central Pennsylvania, the nearest is Westminster, MD: www.blackcatsystems.com/kiwi.html by Chris Smolinski, W3HFU. Select from a menu of receiving antennas that closely matches your system. After selecting your band of interest, you can observe and hear what reception is like for your area.

Paul Herrman (N0NBH) Solar Data/Propagation banners and

widgets are legendary in the amateur radio. www.hamqsl.com/solar.html has a plethora of information found in many places. A commonly accessed website is QRZ.com. His banners reflect worldwide conditions rather than local.

Watch DX Clusters. Set your filters for stations nearby you. Watch for DX spottings per band. Clusters can give you a rough way of determining what band is open. A favorite is www.dxwatch.com, but there are many others.

VOACAP. Although more work is needed to use the website, www.voacap.com/hf/ can give you hypothetical propagation for specific areas.

The Harrisburg Radio Amateur

Club hosted our statewide convention this year and will be the host for next years convention. The Firecracker Hamfest, ARRL Pennsylvania State Convention, will be on July 2nd, 2022.

When I listen on the talk-in frequencies for the Hamfests I've attended, I don't hear much on 2 meters. Very few people call in. I guess this is partially because GPS has become so prolific we don't

need talk in when we get close. GPS takes "Listen ous to the front door. On the way to a Ham-

fest, call in and tell the Ham you are on your way. Let's generate some traffic. I'm looking forward to meeting you in person at a Hamfest or club meeting. If you hear me on the air give me a shout!

Another note about mobile operation. I routinely travel several hours getting to Hamfests. I pass through the coverage areas for several repeaters every time. VHF/ UHF use is down. Cell phones killed that.

I program repeaters into my rig for whatever route I'm taking, but I also monitor 146.52. In fact, I have a sticker in my rear window announcing that I'm monitoring 146.52 MHz. Admittedly, I don't get a lot of QSO's on 52, but I do try. When you're out and about, set up your rig to monitor for traffic on 146.52. Making sure I have the correct settings for repeaters is

time consuming and the PL's sometimes get changed from what is published. I set one band to 146.52 and the other band for repeaters and scanning. Listen on 52 for people passing through.

Have you been able to take advantage of the on-line training for Skywarn? I've seen some interesting Skywarn videos on YouTube.

We are continuing our **search for a Section Emergency Coordinator**; this is an extremely important appointment. The Section emergency Coordinator is arguably the most important appointment in any Section. If you know a good candidate, ask them to contact me. the decision will ultimately be decided by a panel of EPA Section Officials.

How many radio amateurs are there worldwide?

In his YouTube talk of September 7[, 2021] the RSGB General Manager [Steve Thomas, M1ACB] quoted 3 million as the number of radio amateurs worldwide but where did this number come from?

A figure of 3 million has been widely quoted over the last 20 years and is the figure that was published by the IARU in 2000.

In the last century the IARU used to regularly collect statistics for the number of radio amateurs in each country and IARU published these amateur radio operator global totals:

2000 - 2,986,772

1995 - 2,646,000

1990 - 1,967,000

1985 - 1,489,000

1980 - 1,134,000

1975 - 737,000

1970 - 525,000

Unfortunately IARU stopped collecting the data just at the point when amateur radio numbers started to decline. Data is available elsewhere for a few of the larger amateur radio countries and except for the USA this shows a steady decline in radio amateurs since

2000. For example the number of amateur radio stations in Japan has fallen by over 600,000 in the past 20 years, see Amateur Radio Licensing Statistics at ah0a.org/AH0A.html

In some countries there are separate operator and station permits, Japan is one such case. The Operator total given in the AH0A table is for all the amateurs that have ever lived since the 1950's. They are not all still alive or even interested in the hobby anymore. A better indication of numbers is provided by the Station license totals.

So how many radio amateurs are there in 2021? The answer is no-one knows but it's likely to be closer to 1.75 million than to 3 million."


