he Harrisburg Radio Amateurs Club Inc., [HRAC] formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II, many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fifty-eight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a non-profit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways. HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has three hamfests throughout the year: July's Firecracker Hamfest /Eastern Pa Section Convention is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the convention, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: Oktoberfest. Third: the well attended WinterFest in January is an indoor tailgate fest.

Webmaster Report – February 2022 Club Meeting

Dear HRAC Club Members,

Since January 2022 meeting, we started to examine and plan action on the projects and tasks that backlogged during our unfortunate bout with COVID. In addition to keeping the website up and running under normal operations, we continued to add content for club meetings and nets by selecting key announcements to be posted on a weekly, sometimes daily basis from trusted and select resources (i.e., ARRL, QRZ and Amateur Radio Newsline). Also turned over several key pages, including License Exam and dates have come and gone.

Pushing through towards the end of Q1 2022, we will be continuing normal operations as mentioned above while addressing key backlogged projects from 2021 including SSL security certificate and Photo Album, followed closely by continued announcement updates and Elmer Time resources. We have obtained a wildcard SSL certificate through Let's Encrypt. This is a new foundation with a mission to provide high quality, high secure certificates for free (sponsored by the likes of Cisco, Amazon, and Mozilla to name a few). We are in the process of identifying the best SSL plug-in that will match our website and making deployment within the month of March. Note, as we go through the process of securing the website, some pages might experience minimal downtime as we progress, but reset assured it is our mission to keep all downtime to a minimum except for known maintenance periods. Once the SSL certificate project is done, we'll be identifying and applying a plug-in that is appropriate for our Photo Album. That will be in the March early April period.





HARRISBURG HAM HISTORY — 100 years ago —

3 AGT

The amateur radio station operated and owned jointly by F. W. Cocklin and W. L. Gardner at 1630 North Fifth street, is said to be one of the foremost amateur radio stations in Harrisburg. Although handicapped somewhat by induction, this station has made great headway in radio work. Both Mr. Cocklin and Gardner are "old-timers" in the radio game, having been active in the development o radio since 1910. They have both served in the Signal Corps of the United States Army during the World Warand are prominent members of the Harrisburg Radio Club.

and are prominent members of the Harrisburg Radio Club.

With their present set they have been able to work as far as Burlington, Vt.; Racine, Wis.; South Nashville, Tenn.; and 450 miles off the Atlantic coast. This station recently handled a message from Governor W. C. Sproul to President W. G. Harding. This was known in the amateur radio field as the Governor's-President's relay.

The transmitting set consists of

The transmitting set consists of 1 KW Acme non-resonant transformer, homemade condenser (plate glass and copper coil immersed in oil), high speed aluminum spark gap, homemade O. T. primary made of three turns of three-inch brass ribbon; secondary, constructed of seven turns of two-inch brass ribbon and six inches of coupling with a maximum radiator of 5.24 amperes, anchor gap, protective devices and ammeter.

The receiving set consists of a

Vices and ammeter.

The receiving set consists of a Westinghouse (RC) receiver and Baldwin phones type F. The antenna is of the inverted L type, made of four strands o silicon bronze, seventy feet long and sixty feet high. The ground system constitutes a four-wire counterpoise, earth plates and waterpipes.

"Some New Rules Going into Effect this Year for ARRL Field Day

After the issuance of several rules waivers over the past couple of years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, ARRL Field Day rules are being updated on a permanent basis starting with the June 25-26, 2022, event. The maximum PEP output for a transmitter used by anyone submitting a Field Day entry will be 100 W, regardless of entry category.

Class D (Home) stations will continue to be able to earn points for contacts with other Class D stations. The club aggregate scoring change initiated in 2020 as a temporary measure will become part of the permanent rules. In the aggregate scoring plan, the scores of individual stations are combined under the aggregate score of a club that is designated on the individual entry form.

Another change, involving Media Publicity Rule 7.3.2, has been modified. Field Day participants will now be required to obtain publicity, not just try to do so. Any combination of bona fide media hits would qualify for the bonus points. For example, posting the details of your upcoming or ongoing Field Day activity, or your Field Day results, on a club or news media site, on Facebook, or via Twitter and Instagram would meet the bonus criteria.
