he Harrisburg Radio Amateurs Club Inc., [HRAC] formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II, many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fifty-eight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a non-profit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways. HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has three hamfests throughout the year: July's Firecracker Hamfest /Eastern Pa Section Convention is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the convention, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: Oktoberfest. Third: the well attended WinterFest in January is an indoor tailgate fest.



HARRISBURG HAM HISTORY — May, 100 years ago —

Harrisburg Radio Club Adds Equipment; Membership Increasing Rapidly

"The Detector Tube and Its, Operations" will be the topic of an address to be given by Horace B. Pratt, of the Pennsylvania State Experimental Laboratory Monday evening at 8 o'clock to the members of the Harrisburg Radio Club in the club house at Twenty-first and Bellevue road. This is one of a series of lectures being given by Mr. Pratt to the members of this club, of which he is a member.

At a recent meeting held in the club house a new storage battery and magnetic rectifier were added to the club's equipment. George Vanier, of the Baldwin Radio Supply Company, of Steelton, gave a talk at this meeting on the care of the storage battery, which was followed by a discussion by the members on radio work.

On account of the inability of the organization to secure a set of Baldwin phones, the radio department of Dives, Pomeroy and Stewart loaned the club a similar make of felephones for its use. W. L. Gardner was authorized at the last session to place the station's transmitting license under his name.

REPEATER COMMITTEE — Terry, WB₃BKN, reported the repeater controller is now on again. However, the telephone line is dead, possibly because it is an outdated model.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE — Chair Tim, W4NKC, was not present, but his XYL Linda, KB3RCY, gave Dave, KC3MG, a report. Currently, there are 77 members, of which 49 are ARRL members or 63.6%.

NEWSLETTER COMMITTEE — Curt, K₃URT, reports the next article deadline is by the end of business day, Wednesday, May 4th. Also, the newsletter contact email has changed to newsletter@wʒuu.org. The old email address will be monitored until July 1st, then discontinued.

WEB PAGE COMMITTEE — Mike, KD₃MAD, was absent but sent a brief email report to be followed in the following newsletter. Still, a significant change is a transition from Google Search statistics to information on better overall page traffic reporting. He is looking for help in the vast upkeep of the website—notations from Bob, K₃RTS, and Curt, K₃URT.

NEW BUSINESS — Terry, WB₃BKN discussed the difficulty of accessing and repairing the club repeater. Currently, the club's Motorola equipment is aging. No resolution yet - all in general discussion.

ADJOURNMENT — A motion to adjourn by Steve, KC3EUU, and seconded by Chuck, KW3W. The meeting closed at 2022L.

Annual Armed Forces Day Cross-Band Exercise marked for May 14

The 2022 running of the Armed Forces Day (AFD) Cross-Band exercise will be held on May 14, 1300 - 2200 UTC. The event is open to all radio amateurs.

Armed Forces Day is May 21, but the AFD Cross-band Military-Amateur Radio event traditionally takes place one week earlier. During the exercise, radio amateurs listen for stations on military operating frequencies and transmit on frequencies in adjacent amateur bands.

Military and amateur stations have taken part in this event for more than 50 years.

"The AFD Cross-band Test is a unique opportunity to test two-way communications between military communicators and radio stations in the Amateur Radio Service, as authorized in 47 CFR 97.111. These tests provide opportunities and challenges for radio operators to demonstrate individual technical skills in a tightly controlled exercise scenario that does not impact any public or private communications."

Military stations in various locations will transmit on selected military frequencies and announce the specific ham band frequencies they are monitoring.

An AFD message will be transmitted utilizing the Military Standard (MIL-STD) serial PSK waveform (M110) followed by MIL-STD Wide Shift FSK (850 Hz RTTY), as described in MIL-STD 188-110A/B. The AFD message will also be sent in CW and RTTY. — www.arrl.org/news/annual-armed-forces-daycross-band-exercise-set-for-may-14

Dauphin County ARES Participation in EPA Simulated Emergency Test (SET)

- Evaluate effectiveness of county units to pass HF traffic on emergency power to command post (SEC / SM). The Dauphin County EC will pass the HF message to SM /SEC.
- Evaluate ability of county ARES units to pass VHF UHF message traffic via digital and phone modes to EC.
- Each participating operator should try to actively deploy to a simulated shelter which will be the closes firehouse to their home or operate from a home station. Do NOT contact the firehouse or attempt to activate from the firehouse. You only need to be in proximity to the firehouse. You should set up on public street or roadway (safely) nearby. Each member operating from a home station or deployed to a designated site must use emergency power (battery, generator, etc.) to receive points.
- VHF / UHF Traffic Handling must involve using an ICS-213 message form. The content of the message should simulate traffic that would be passed from a site, such as a shelter, to a recipient at a county 911 center or served agency (Red Cross, etc.). This can be passed via voice during nets. VHF Traffic passing will be on the 145.11 repeater on the following schedule:
- Friday May 20: 2000L
- Saturday-May 21: 0800L


