

The Harrisburg Radio Amateurs Club Inc., [HRAC] formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II. many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fifty-eight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a nonprofit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways. HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has three hamfests throughout the year: July's Firecracker Hamfest / Eastern Pennsylvania Section Convention is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the convention, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: Oktoberfest. Third: the well attended WinterFest in January is an indoor tailgate fest.

EMCOMM: the rough weather season approaches

The EmComm Training Organization is expecting to return to training operations in mid-March 2023. We're looking for people with general Winlink experience to help develop and write exercises. A background in EmComm is a plus but not required. This includes exercise writers but also separate exercise reviewers. And then we want to have a team of exercise testers.

Exercise Writers: This team works together to develop exercises from scratch or take previously implemented exercises and fashion them into a new exercise either totally new or repeat for emphasis on a training need.

Exercise Reviewers: One thing we've learned is to never

problems, etc. and report it back to the Exercise Writers.

The Writers Team and the Reviewer teams must work together in concert so you can expect to huddle with one group of writers or reviewers during one exercise and end up in a different set of writers and reviews in the next exercise. This idea is to mitigate burn-out through a general rotation process. Each team with have a designated volunteer lead/coordinator.

And something important; We recognize writing, especially from scratch, will inevitably contain errors. That's expected and a natural part of the development process. Getting the final text written in a way that is clear and concise as much as possible is the important part.



review your own exercise. The exercise review team reviews a newly developed exercise without the bias of having written it. One tends to naturally read-through their own writing mistakes since they are familiar with text and tend to overlook errors. A new and unfamiliar eye tends to find errors.

Exercise Testing Team: This is a new team. Before the exercise goes out to ETO members, it gets tested by a group of user volunteers. They "road-test" the exercise looking for any instruction confusion or misinterpretation, process errors or misdirection, and unforeseen execution

We'll organize a zoom meeting where we can answer questions and discuss an approach to achieving these import objectives based on the feedback we get from you. When a team forms up, we'll be able to do some easy exercises (I.E. ICS-213, Check-in, etc.) in a short period of time.
