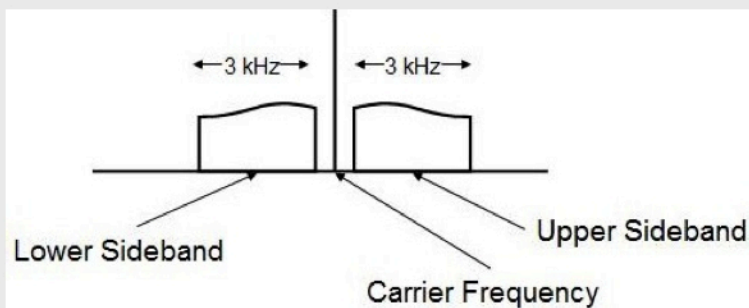

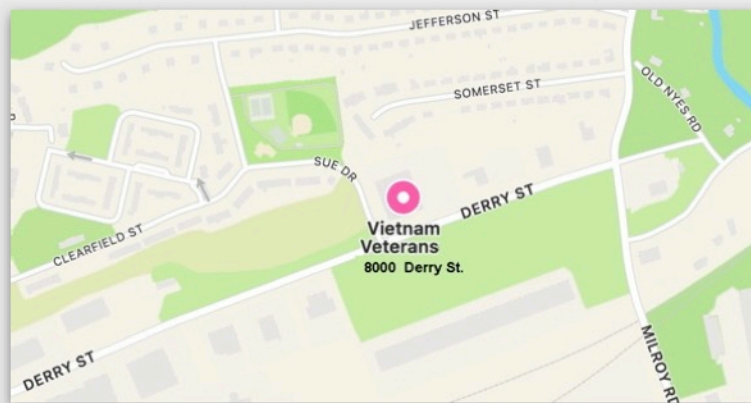

The Harrisburg Radio Amateurs Club Inc., [HRAC] formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II, many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fifty-eight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a non-profit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways. HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has three hamfests throughout the year: July's **Firecracker Hamfest** / Eastern Pennsylvania Section Convention is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the convention, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: **Oktoberfest**. Third: the well attended **WinterFest** in January is an indoor tailgate fest.

Amateurs in Belgium get 8-meter band

Belgium have been given privileges on between 40.660 and 40.690 MHz. Operators in South Africa, Slovenia and Ireland already have access. The regulator, Belgian Institute for Postal Services (BIPT), informed the Royal Belgian Amateur Radio Union (UBA) that amateurs must be holders of an operating certificate (HAREC):

- ERP limited to 5W;
- The transmission modes are restricted to A1A, F3E, J2D, J2B and J3E;
- The holder shall keep a logbook stating the date, the start and end time in UTC, the call sign of the station worked, the used frequency, the transmission mode and power.

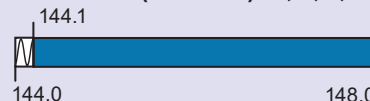

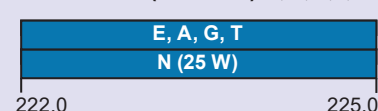

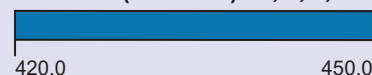

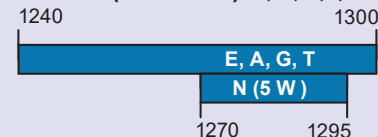

The **Solar Eclipse QSO Party** (SEQP) is an opportunity for amateur radio operators to operate during the October 2023 and April 2024 eclipses before, during, and after they pass over North America. Using various modes (CW, voice, and digital), two-way transmissions (QSOs) made during the SEQP will contribute to scientific studies focusing on the ionosphere's reaction to the eclipse. The studies should lead to a better understanding of the interactions between the Sun, the ionosphere, and radio wave propagation. That research should benefit hams, professional broadcasters, satellite operators, and other radio spectrum users.

☑ All contacts must be made within the contact window: Friday, **13th October** at 2 p.m. EDT until Saturday, 14th October at 2 a.m. EDT (1800 UTC 2023-10-13 until 0600 UTC 2023-10-14).

☑ All contacts must be made within the amateur radio spectrum.

☑ Spotting is encouraged; excessive self spotting is discouraged.

☑ Operators are encouraged to operate only in the following bands/windows:

3580-3600 kHz 7080-7100 kHz,
14080-14100 kHz 21080-21100 kHz
28080-28100 kHz as to not cause interference with normal FT8, FT4 and CW operations.

Scoring and Multipliers:
